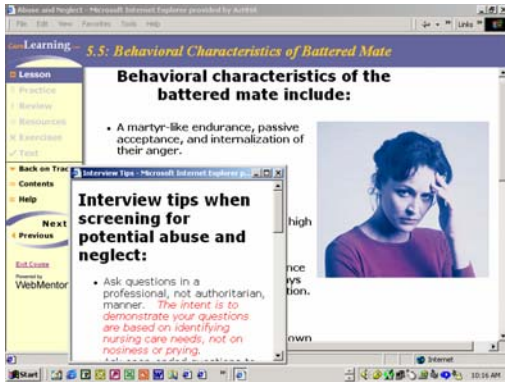

When Joint Commission surveys a healthcare organization, it will evaluate whether that organization has developed and implemented criteria to identify possible victims of abuse or neglect. This web-based course is an outstanding teaching tool for healthcare professionals who need to know how to recognize and respond to signs of abuse or neglect in patients who present at their facility. The course focuses on types and definitions of elder abuse and neglect, child abuse and neglect, and domestic violence. Diagrams illustrating clinical signs of abuse and neglect and tips for interviewing/screening patients are provided.

Highlights of Abuse and Neglect Course:

- The types of abuse and neglect as well as the key physical and behavioral indicators for those areas are identified and defined. The abuser's behavior in these circumstances is also identified.
- Discusses domestic violence and looks in-depth at the key behavioral characteristics of both batterers and victims. The course also identifies the behavioral characteristics of children from violent homes and specific situations that put victims at higher risk for violence.
- Identifies the professional responsibilities of healthcare providers in cases of abuse or neglect, including the potential penalties for not reporting.
