

Streamline Access to Care for Texans Experiencing Psychiatric Crisis



Texas hospitals support **House Bill 186** by Rep. Julie Johnson to streamline access to emergency inpatient mental health treatment for individuals experiencing a psychiatric crisis.

HB 186 would clarify current law to streamline patients' access to emergency psychiatric treatment by allowing a clinician to request an Order of Protective Custody—a requirement before care can be provided—in the county in which the assessing hospital or emergency room is located.

Order of Protective Custody:

A court ordered mental health commitment issued by a judge for an individual who is found to be mentally ill to the degree that there is a substantial risk of serious harm to self or others unless the person is immediately restrained.

Only after a judge issues an OPC can a patient receive more intensive, specialized inpatient mental health treatment.











HB 186 would clarify that clinicians may request an OPC in the county in which the assessing hospital or emergency department is located in order to **streamline the patient's access to medically necessary treatment.**



For example, a patient experiencing a mental health crisis may be apprehended

could otherwise be providing intensive, specialized care to meet the patient's immediate mental health needs.
