## Urge Your Senators to Add Provisions to Support Hospitals and Health Systems in COVID-19 Relief Legislation

Priorities include more funding for Provider Relief Fund; eliminating Medicare sequester cuts; forgiveness for accelerated payments; among other issues

The House of Representatives Feb. 27 approved the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, legislation to provide reconciliation protection for a roughly \$1.9 trillion COVID-19 relief package. The bill has a number of policies important to hospitals and health systems, including expanding subsidies for certain forms of health care coverage and provisions to bolster the nation's COVID-19 health care response with additional resources for vaccines, treatment, personal protective equipment, testing, contact tracing and workforce development. **See our Special Bulletin for a summary**.

The action now moves to the Senate, which is expected to take up the legislation and amend it with its own COVID-19 reconciliation bill. That process is expected to start this week. The Senate parliamentarian ruled last week that a provision to increase the minimum wage to \$15 could not be included in the package because it violated reconciliation rules, so additional funding could be available to allocate to other issues.

## Please contact your senators today and ask them to add these additional provisions to the legislation:

- More funding for the Provider Relief Fund (PRF). Given allocations made to date and COVID-19 relief legislation passed in December directing use of the funds, only \$4.4 billion will be available for disbursement to hospitals and health systems and other health care providers. - An extension of the moratorium on the Medicare sequester cuts.
- Forgiveness for Medicare accelerated payments for hospitals.

In addition to the priorities mentioned above, as part of the legislation, please ask your legislators to: provide more support for state health programs, including Federal Medical

Assistance Percentages (FMAP); include more federal <u>support for front-line health care</u> <u>workers</u>; and reset the Improving Medicare Post-Acute Care Transformation Act to reflect both new insights from the pandemic and the effect of recent transformative reforms of the existing post-acute care payment systems. It also is important that Congress **not** include any provisions that would require <u>new</u>, <u>unrealistic and burdensome Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA)</u> standards.
